The science fiction writer, Frederic Brown, is credited to write the shortest story in the world in 1948, which he called "Knock". The story was this: "The last man on Earth sat alone in a room. There was a knock on the door." The story paved the way to a new fashion of writing very short stories, which are often published in compilations, such as "The World's Shortest Stories of Love and Death." ~~by St~~

One of the best books of its kind, ~~is~~ this collection of small masterpieces is actually comprised of the winning works of authors who took part in the "55 Fiction" competition, started in 1987 by Steve Moss, editor of the New Times magazine. The competition runs ^{annually} to this day, accepting literary works that meet the following criteria: no more than 55 words per story, the presence of a setting, some characters, ~~and a resolved~~ a conflict and its outcome.

Steve Moss published ~~the~~ "The World's Shortest Stories of Love and Death" in 1999, amazing readers with the ^{sheer} diversity of the works comprised. Take, for instance, ~~the~~ "In the Garden" and "Higher Education".

Overall, this author believes that the collection is a delightful read.
