The science fiction writer, Frederic Brown, is credited to write the shortest story in the world in 1948, which he called "Knock". The story was this: "The last man on Earth sat alone in a room. There was a knock on the door." The story paved the way to a new fashion of writing very short stories. A number of such stories have been made up since then. However, it was not until 1989 that some of the best ones were published in the book The World's Shortest Stories of Love and Death by Steve Moss.

The book contains works written by the participants of a competition named 55 Fiction, which was organised by Steve Moss in 1987 and has been held every year up to the present. If you want to take part in it, your story must have no more than 55 words, a setting, at least one character, a conflict and a resolution.

Though the allowed number of words may seem tiny, exceedingly the authors of the stories contained in the book managed to come up with absorbing plots and make us think about important issues at the same time. For example, Gratitude by Andrew E. Hunt touches on poverty whereas The Search by Robert Tompkins tells us deals with the impossibility of finding the truth. Nonetheless, the stories cause different emotions. While some of them, like In the Garden by Hope A. Torres, are humorous, others, like Gratitude Higher Education by Ron Bast cause nothing but sadness.

I have read the book myself and can't help praising it. Not only did I enjoy it, but also it made me changed my opinion on dozens of issues. The book is out
