In fact there is a book by Steve Moss ~~author~~ named "The World's Shortest Stories of Love and Death", which contains many examples of those stories.

Steve Moss, a "New Times" editor ~~started~~ began a writing contest called "55 Fiction" in 1987, which is still held every year in said magazine. To be eligible for competition, a story must have no more than 55 words in it, ~~some setting~~ ~~characters~~ ~~and~~ a setup, at least one character, a conflict and a resolution to it. In 1999, Steve Moss took the best stories and put them together in the said book. Let's compare some ~~samples from the~~ stories from this book.
