The science fiction writer, Frederic Brown, is credited to write the shortest story in the world in 1948, which he called "Knock". The story was this: "The last man on Earth sat alone in a room. There was a knock on the door. The story paved a way to a new fashion of writing very short stories. A collection of such stories was published by Steve Moss in the book "The World's Shortest Stories of Love and Death" in 1999. It was a collection of the best stories from a competition called "55 Fiction", which Moss himself had started in 1987, being an editor of the American magazine New Times. The competition still runs annually in the same magazine.

Moss' book consists of short stories of 55 or fewer words, each of them having a setting, at least one character, some conflict and a resolution. The book, as evident from its title, has stories of different genres in it for example, the story "Gratitude" by Andrew E. Hunt gives us a glimpse into the life of a homeless man, while Ron Bast's "Higher Education" shows us a terrifying picture of an under educated man in charge of people's lives. "In the Garden" (by Mope A. Tormes) is a comedy, and "The Search" (by Robert Tompkins) is a philosophical story. Steve Moss has made a great effort of collecting and presenting the stories,
