Over the next decades, such stories became increasingly more popular. However, don't be fooled into thinking that simply because of their length, they are easy to write. Finding true gems in a sea of ~~mediocre works~~ <sup>mediocrities</sup> can be hard work.

That's exactly what Steve Moss tried to do when he set off to discover the best of ~~such~~ said stories in 1987. He started a competition, promptly named "55 Fiction", in the New Times magazine. ~~The~~ ~~it~~ ~~still~~ runs annually to this day, by the way. The rules are simple: the story should be no longer than 55 words, and contain a setting, at least one character, a conflict, and its resolution.

After 12 years, Moss published the best stories he found in "The World's Shortest Stories of Love and Death". They all seem similar, but ~~are~~ <sup>are</sup> so distinct. Some are devoid of any comedy focusing purely on our morbid reality. "Gratitude" is a great example of that, describing the lack of respect a war veteran can get. Others, like "Higher Education" and "In the Garden", ~~have something~~ have potential to be turned into comedy skits, although the humor is pretty dark. "The Search" tells a story of a man who was looking for truth and found it in the form of a "wrinkled hag". Perhaps, the phrase "ugly truth" was taken a bit too far?

In any case, the book was very enjoyable for me.
