The science fiction writer, Frederic Brown, is credited to write the shortest story in the world in 1948, which he called "Knock". ~~The last man on Earth sat alone in a room~~ The story was this: "The last man on Earth sat alone in a room. There was a knock on the door." The story paved the way to a new fashion of writing very short stories, carrying an enormous meaning and exposing the vices of life.

An editor of the American magazine New Times, Steve Moss, started a competition in writing short stories called 55 Fiction in 1987. He included the best stories in the book *The World's Shortest Stories of Love and Death*.

I will comment on the samples from this unique book.

Andrew E. Hunt in *Gratitude* writes about an old man, who does not take life for granted and thanks God for all. However, he wears shoes that he found in the dumpster.

Ron Brust in his 'Higher Education' exposes the frightening truth of education in universities. Even a surgeon is not competent enough but probably it is not his fault.

Kope A. Torres in the story 'In the Garden' tells us about a very cruel love: Tom does not pay any attention to Tina's feelings, he cares only about his prize-winning vote. Tom is a very cold and arrogant person.

Robert Tompkins investigates the origins of Truth and Lie. Probably his message is: truth has to come over a lot of difficulties as everyone tries to distort or affect it.

These samples have different plots and characters, but the fact that they expose the vices of people and would itself unites them. They ~~also~~ also have positive and negative characters. However, it is hard to tell whether in *Gratitude* the man is bad or good.
